Our board of directors decided it was time to create a logo that would represent our organization. We worked to find a logo that would have a fresh representation of our organization and identity. We started with a discussion of our logo's purpose as a visual image. Several board members conveyed that they would like to see a logo that was "modern," or "conveyed movement" or "abstract." As much as we all love Chinese food and restaurants, we were also all in agreement that we did not want our new logo to convey a message that we are a Chinese eating establishment!

We worked with a graphic design company and submitted to them a summary of our organization. We reviewed over 100 logo submissions. After a month and a half of progress working with many graphic designers, we voted on a new logo. It was selected by a democratic process – whichever logo was chosen had received the most votes.

Our new logo will slowly roll out on our letterhead, social media accounts, and our new House of China flag. We hope this logo selected by our board of directors will be a lasting symbol our values and mission, to share and promote our traditions, culture, and friendship.



Anna May Wong



Anna May Wong is considered to be the first Chinese American film star in Hollywood during the 1920s and 30s. She is the first Asian American to ever be portrayed on U.S. currency, as of Oct. 24.

In January 2022, the United States Mint's American Women Quarters Program began producing coins that featured the portraits of significant women in U.S. history. This production of quarters is a four-year celebration that will include the faces of 20 different women by 2025. Wong and the other nominees were selected in 2021 by the public. Through a web portal established by the National Women's History Museum, participants were allowed to submit recommendations that they felt were deserving of the honor.

Wong was chosen due to her tenacity and strength as a female minority in the film industry, while being subjected to stereotypical supporting roles for the majority of her career.

Anna May Wong was born Wong Liu Tsong in Los Angeles, CA in 1905. Though she was born and raised in the United States, Wong was still the victim of discrimination throughout her life. As she began to pursue a career in acting, she took on the stage name Anna May Wong - a culmination of her English and Chinese name.

After facing constant discrimination in Hollywood, Wong traveled to Europe and worked in English, German, and French films. She also appeared in productions on the London and New York stages.

Wong was awarded a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame in 1960. She died on February 3, 1961. She is remembered as an international film star, fashion icon, television trailblazer, and a champion for greater representation of Asian Americans in film. She continues to inspire actors and filmmakers today.
