#### **GONG HAY FAT CHOY!**

This is one of best times of the year. As many Asians around the world will look forward their Lunar New Year celebration with their loved ones, San Diego is no exception. We have many Lunar New Year celebrations and traditions throughout the city.

You will notice around the town, especially in areas with Asian businesses that the store fronts and entry ways will be decorated with red and gold colors. These colors are symbolic of happiness and prosperity. Some families will also hang couplets on their entry way with words of blessings for their home and family. Many will also buy new clothes, and some will clean their home to sweep the bad luck away.

A favorite are the special foods eaten during the New Year – like shrimp for happiness and dumplings for wealth. The Chinese word for shrimp sounds like laughter. Chinese dumplings look like Chinese gold ingots. We also love to eat many dried fruits and nuts. Families will have these special sweets laid out on tables in red lacquer bowls. One of our family favorites include *lien go* which is a cake made from rice flour. We love to fry it with an egg wash, which makes it warm, crispy outside and gooey inside. It's a sticky and chewy sweet treat that we only eat during the holidays.

And children love the special red envelops called *hong bao* that their family and friends give them for good luck. When you give children a *hong bao*, the children will say a special blessing and wish you a happy new year! You will hear children say, "Gong Hay Fat Choy" (Cantonese for May You Be Happy and Prosperous) or "Sun Leen Fai Lok" (Cantonese for Happy New Year). Lunar New Year is full of symbolism and optimism for a new beginning.

Here in San Diego, the House of China will celebrate with our annual two-day festival on February 15-16, 2025. We have musicians, folk dancing, singing, and the very popular lion dancing to scare away all the bad spirits. We also have many local vendors selling craft items and delicious food. Please come and bring your family and friends!

We hope you will find a festive way to celebrate and enjoy the Year of the Snake. From all of us at the House of China, we wish you and your family will be blessed with love, happiness, good health and great prosperity in 2025.
